Functions of IPOPHL (1)

- Examines applications for grant of letters of patent for inventions and register utility models and industrial design.
- Examines applications for the registration of marks (including internet domain names as marks), geographical indications, and integrated circuits.
- Registers technology transfer arrangements, settles disputes involving technology transfer payments, and develops and implements strategies to promote and facilitate technology transfer.



• Functions of IPOPHL(2)

- Promotes the use of patent information as a tool for technology development.
- Publishes regularly the patents, marks, utility models, and industrial designs issued and approved, and the technology transfer arrangements registered.



Functions of IPOPHL (4)

- Publishes regularly the patents, marks, utility models, and industrial designs issued and approved, and the technology transfer arrangements registered.
- Coordinates with other government agencies and the private sector to strengthen the protection and enforcement of intellectual property rights in the country.
- Administratively adjudicates cases affecting intellectual property rights:
- Complaints for violation of laws involving Intellectual property rights
- Opposition to/cancellation of registration marks
- Cancellation of patents, compulsory licensing

WHAT is Intellectual Property?

Intellectual Property (IP) is the creations or product of the human mind;

it describes ideas, inventions, technologies, artworks, music and literature that are intangible when first created, but become valuable in tangible form as products (Dr. Kamil Idris)



WHY we should **PROTECT** our **IP**?

- prevent competitors from copying your technology or product
- avoid wasteful investment in R&D and marketing
- create and enhance corporate identity
- facilitate negotiations on licensing, franchising or other IP-based agreements



WHY we should PROTECT our IP?

- increase the company's market value
- acquire venture capital
- enhance access to new markets
- avoid unnecessary litigation



WHAT HAPPENS IF NO IP PROTECTION IS OBTAINED FOR AN INTELLECTUAL CREATION?

~ Somebody else might obtain IP Protection for it.

~ Competitors will take advantage of the intellectual creation or IP.

~ Possibilities to license, sell or transfer technology will be severely hindered.
